Part A

The B.Ed. session 2012-13 started on 1st August ,2012 with an orientation progrmme which began with a short prayer invoking God's Blessing on all followed by lighting of lamp by REV. Fr. Seminars & Workshops

In order to enrich and empower our trainees several seminars and workshops were conducted during the academic year. Among them were seminars on Cooperative Learning, Specific Objectives, microteaching, planning lesson, Learning Styles, and mentoring. They were conducted by the staff members Besides Seminars and workshops, National Seminar was also conducted.

A National Seminar on Education in the "21st Century – Challenges and Opportunities "was conducted in the college on 16th February 2013. Delegates from all over the country were involve1d in effective discussion. The full papers were published in the book with ISBN-Number (978-93-82570-02-8). Dr.E.Ram Ganesh, Director, Centre for Curriculum Development, Bharathidasan University, Dr. P. Veerappan Professor and Head(Retd), Department of Education -NCERT, Dr. Sr. Victoria, Province co-ordinator, Bon Secours Congregation and Dr. K. Anna durai, Professor and Head, Scientific Tamil Development, Tamil University, Thanjavur were the Resource Persons present on the Day.

A workshop on "Bloom's Taxonomy "was organized as a Faculty Development Programme for the staff members. Dr. G.Pazhanivel, Assistant Professor in Education, Tamil University conducted the programme and trained to write the lesson plan on the basis of knowledge, Understanding application and skills.

SUPW Seminar

The SUPW Workshop was Conducted on 17th January 2013 in Bon Secours College of Education. The Students were given Seminar on Socially useful productive work by Sr.Tony, Teacher St.Joseph's Higher Secondary School. She taught to prepare many useful things and such as Washing powder, Asafoetida, Phenyls, Omam Water, Shampoo, Candles, etc.

Seminar on Arts and Crafts

According to Instruction given by the Instructor Sr.Anthoniyammal, the following objects were prepared by the B.Ed Students. They are Paper Bird, Paper

Flower, Flower wash, Pot Painting, Thread Work, Office Cover, File, Glass Painting, Low Cost Materials (Egg Shell Hand Work, Wastage Paper Hand Work), etc.

Cultural Functions & Celebrations:

The cultural functions organized by the students were moderated by the resourceful faculty members. The cultural events were Bon 2012, Teacher's Day, College Day, Christmas Gathering, Pongal function, Women's Day, and the Science and Literature Club activities.

Besides the cultural functions, celebrations on various occasions like Feast of Bon Secours on August $3^{\rm rd}$, Independence Day, Republic Day were held. Further, too we had birthday celebrations of every member of the Bon Secours.

Tests & Competitions:

To Gain "Quality Education in B.Ed", They also participated in Quiz Competition, Poetry Competition, Poster competition, Role Play, Debate, Patriotic Song competition on National Festival Days. Winners are given Medals/Prizes and certificates. Besides these, Each one Teach one are regular features of the college. They also took part in 5 cycle tests, 4 class tests, and one university examination. The students also Participated in 6 psychology praticals (Intelligence Test, Attitude, Aptitude, Interest. Intelligence quotient and personality assessment) a case study and presented a project report on it.

Regarding the Examination 3 Internal Test, 2 Revision Test and 1 Model Test were conducted. They were evaluated. Suitable suggestions were given. Slow learners were identified and given special treatment. Additionally, The M.Ed students were trained in using SPSS Package in Analysising their data in Research Methodology. Mr.M.Muthusamy, Senate Member, Bharathidasan University on 20th December 2012 trained the M.Ed student to gain knowledge on statistical techniques.

Pre –Practice teaching And Practice Teaching:

The trainees were introduced to formulation of specific objectives, questioning techniques, introduction to Bloom's taxonomy of educational objectives, audio visual aids etc. at the beginning of the session itself. After having gone through the seminar on microteaching, the students were put through various exercises to

sharpen their teaching skills. A video shoot was taken and the mistakes were corrected in microteaching . Teacher Educators took model lessons in each of the method subjects.

Subsequently simulation classes and criticism classes in each of the method subjects were taken by the trainees. After having gone through pre-practice teaching, the trainees were sent to the co-operating schools for practice teaching and internship from 3rd October to 2nd December, 2012. Classes were supervised by the respective school teachers and the own lecturers. The Principal expressed heart-felt thanks to the Principals and teachers of all the co-operating schools for providing ample opportunity for the trainees to better themselves as good teachers and facilitators of learning.

Annual Sports Festival:

The 10th Annual Sports Festival was held on 30th August, 2012. Importance is always given to sports and Games by Bon Secours College of Education, Sports Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm on 30th August 2012. Rev.Sr.Marceline Education Co-ordinator Bon Secours congregation and Dr.C.Robert Alexander Head. Dept of Physical Education, A.V.V.M Sri pushpam college, Poondi were present during the function. The Chief Guest expressed his great appreciation for the excellent performance and team spirit shown by the trainees. The parents, guardians, alumni and the well wishers who were present in a large number thoroughly enjoyed the events.

Educational Tour and Picnic:

Among the many activities and assessments, we also took time out on 5th May 2013 for a spritual tour to Annai Velankanni . The bus trip, trolly ride, the hot springs and the scenic beauty of the seashore of the location were thoroughly appreciated by one and all.

Research and Documentation:

Research and Documentation is one of the goals of the college. The Faculty Members are fully committed to this. Two of the faculty members are doing their Ph.D work and hopefully submitted soon. Further, papers written by the faculty members are in the process of publication in various journals. Along with these, The research activities is steadily advancing. Action Researches regarding problems and solution of school students were analyzed by Student Teachers.

M.Ed Dissertation

For the Academic year 2012-2013, Thirty Five Dissertation were produced by the M.Ed Students. The Dissertations pointed the problems and solutions in the field of Educational Psychology, Current Educational problems, Environmental Education, Content part of various Disciplines, Examination Stress, Evaluation Techniques etc. They followed Survery Method , Experimental Method, Case Study Method to do the dissertation.

ICT Learning Resources and Spoken English:

Imparting of computer curriculum is part of one paper in the B.Ed. curriculum. The faculty makes use of the new technologies, Power Point Presentation and LCD projectors in curriculum transactional processes. The Educational Technology Laboratory with 22 computers and internet facility is available for all the B.Ed and M.Ed students everyday.

Considering the importance of English for communication in today's globalised world, the trainees who have difficulty in speaking and writing English were offered 40 days Spoken English Programme from 1st August 2012 to 10th September 2012.

Valedictory Function:

Classes for B.Ed ended on 5th May 2013 with a grand Valedictory Function. The students expressed their great appreciation for the college and thanked the faculty and staff for the excellent training they received. At the end of the programme the trainees were given their final assessment report and their completion certificate. The students and the faculty together then took a pledge with lighted candles in their hands to spread the light of wisdom through the length and breadth of the country particularly in the own state of Tamilnadu.

100 students Teachers appeared for the university examination conducted by the Tamilnadu Teachers Education University Chennai from 25th May 2013 to 11th June 2013. The results are awaited.

Classes for M.Ed ended on 20th May 2013. 35 M.Ed candidates appeared for the University Examination conducted by the Tamilnadu Teachers Education University Chennai from 29th May 2013 to 3rd June 2013.

Right in the beginning, the faculty members prepared course outlines with specific objectives for the university examination. All the teachers, through class tests and Internal test and revision Test, kept an eye on successive academic progress of the students.

3. Examination Reforms Implemented

The students' entry knowledge and skills were not formally assessed but attempt was made to know the existing knowledge and skills through interaction with them in the classroom. Language Teachers, formally assessed the entry level of the students, which they used for remedial and advanced level teaching. The Psychology Teacher tested the students' intelligence, achievement motivation,

Teacher effectiveness and personality through Psychological tests and the results were used for personal and academic guidance by the faculty. Together with these tests the students were continually tested and evaluated in the form of cycle tests in theory subjects.

The test scores were used for remedial teaching and academic guidance to all the three groups - the average, the below average and the above average. Thus opportunity was provided for the fullest growth of the total individuality-cognitive, affective and psychomotor.

24. Computer & Internet Access & Training to Teachers & Students

For Teachers the computer and internet service are always there during class time. For students these service are available from 8.30 A.M-9.15A.M., 12.15-1.15 P.M. and 2.30-4.30 P.M. All the teachers and the students availed the computer and internet facility during the year(2012-2013) . Teachers were encouraged to attend training and workshops related to latest technology/ICT.

25. Financial Support to Students

During the academic year 2012 – 2013, 17 B.Ed students and 9 M.Ed students received the Government scholarship Each B.Ed & M.Ed Student mentioned above received Rs.46,500 and Rs.47,500 respectively.

26 Students received the minority scholarship. Recommendation letters and Bonafide certificates were issued by the principal to help students to receive educational loans from the Nationalized banks.

26. Activities & Support from Alumni Association

We have 9 batches of B.Ed students and 4 batches of M.Ed students. As an aftermath of the formal inauguration of the Alumni Association in January 2010, many meetings have been held by the executive committee, planning and conducting various activities for the association. Dr. Pazhanivel Assistant Professor Tamil University Thanjavur, was invited as special guest on 4th march 2013. Alumni's members—assured that they are following the Bon Troch Scheme(Each one Teach one)

27. Activities & Support from P.T.A.

Parents are very co-operative and are available for meetings and other functions of the college. Their suggestions are taken seriously and acted upon.

28. Health Services

Dispensary services of the sister school situated in the same campus is used for any emergency. Awareness programme on HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis and Tuberculosis were held this year. Blood Donation is a regular feature of the college every year. This year the staff and students donated 7 units of blood to the nearby Indian Red Cross Society, Thanjavur .

Extension activities in health and hygiene, teaching the blind and the orphans were done through the community services. The students spent time with the physically and mentally challenged children, Ageing Home and collected and despatched of money, food and clothing materials through other charitable organizations during natural calamities.

We receive vacancy notices from 20 primary and secondary schools and these vacancies were displayed on the notice board of the college to be used by the student-teachers. Their applications were forwarded by the principal of the college. The schools conducted campus interview and 36 students of the college are selected and employed.
